They have continued to get done whatever is needed to be done to serve our clients. Again, we want to emphasize how fortunate MACOA is to have the caliber of employees and volunteers and to see how they are committed to our mission. They are truly an inspiration.

Because of the pandemic, we provided shelf-stable meals for our clients as well as frozen meals and fresh produce for several months. We were able to start back with hot meals the first week of June and we have changed many of our procedures. The volunteers are driving up to the front of our building and not leaving their cars, and the staff is loading their cars with the hot meals and cold items for their route delivery. The temperatures of our volunteers are taken before they head out to the clients' homes. When they arrive at a home, the volunteers are knocking on the door and leaving the food on a chair or table and then stepping back until the client answers the door. Our goal is to keep our clients, volunteers and staff as safe as possible.

We will continue to navigate the unchartered water of this global healthcare crisis and adapt our approaches when necessary. It is a difficult time for our country and a huge adjustment for so many seniors. Please keep our most vulnerable senior population in your prayers. Our thoughts are with all those who have been affected by the virus and our top priority is the safety, health and well-being of our staff, volunteers and clients.

### **FROZEN MEALS PROGRAM - Keeping Seniors Fed during COVID-19**

The MACOA Frozen Meals Program continues to serve seniors even during the pandemic. Although the MACOA offices closed to the public March 31st, arrangements were made with the 130 frozen meals clients to pick up their meals every two weeks.

Between the hours of 12:00 and 3:00 p.m. the MACOA staff sets up a pickup station outside the Welcome Center every other Tuesday. Ten meals and, if available, supplemental food such as canned goods, fruit, and Jello are distributed to the frozen meal clients. This provides the senior with enough food to have one hot meal a day for 10 days.

The Pike Road Frozen Meals Program is also continuing its distribution at a pickup station outside Founder's Station. RSVP volunteer Clara Jehle has been instrumental in helping keep the 13 clients in this community supplied with meals every two weeks.

Our frozen meals providers have also kept working diligently to make sure no senior goes hungry. First United Methodist Church (Montgomery), St. James Church, Providence Presbyterian Church, The Junior League of Montgomery, Mary Ellen's Hearth, Christchurch, King's Table Catering, The Pye Bar, Aldersgate United Methodist Church, and many individuals have cooked, packaged, and delivered to MACOA's freezers.

We are thankful to all our volunteers, meal providers, and staff that are dedicated to making sure our seniors receive nutritious meals.
